Dear Parents/Guardians:

It is our district's number one priority to ensure that our students stay safe AND continue in – person learning this school year. It is our hope that we can continue to have a strong partnership with our families to ensure that our students stay in our schools the entire school year and that we will not have to transition to distance learning at any time.

In order to ensure a safe and orderly school year, we ask that our families do the following:

1. If your child has been confirmed as being positive for COVID – 19, please contact Ms. Nieraeth for further instructions. You may call her at Driftwood at (541) 332 – 2712 or at Pacific at (541) 348 – 2293 or email her at [krista.nieraeth@2cj.k12.or.us](mailto:krista.nieraeth@2cj.k12.or.us).
2. If someone in your household has a confirmed positive test for COVID – 19, please DO NOT send your child to school. Contact Ms. Nieraeth ASAP for further instructions.
3. If your child or someone in your household is showing symptoms of COVID – 19 or has been exposed to someone who has COVID - 19, please DO NOT send your child to school. Contact Ms. Nieraeth ASAP for further instructions.

COVID – 19 symptoms include cough, temperature of 100.4°F or higher, chills, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, new loss of taste or smell.

Please DO NOT send your child to school with any exposures to COVID OR with symptoms of COVID. If we were to have a case of COVID in our schools, it could possibly shut down an entire school for a significant period of time due the number of people exposed. We are relying on our families to keep us informed of any exposures to or cases of COVID and their willingness to work with us to keep COVID at bay in our schools.
